00:

80

00:

81

00:

82

00:

that have been kept as pets,
and integrates them back in the wild.

83

00:

I'm gonna go down and volunteer.

84

00:

Bro', if the apes need humans
to save them, then they're fucked.

85

00:

Pay no attention to him.
He's always dumping on somebody.

86

00:

- That's cool.

- What about you, golden boy?

87

00:

You can't wait to put all those things
you call buildings up in New York.

88

00:

Skyscrapers. No, man, they'll be
beautiful. Touching the clouds.

89

00:

You guys don't realise how good
you have it right now, right here.

90

00:

So eager to get on
with your charmed lives

91

00:

that you miss what's happening now.

92

00:

You know what I mean?

93

00:

94

00:

We got coconuts filled with rum.

95

00:

We got beautiful, gracious chicks that
like us just cos we're Yankees and tall.

97

00:

98

00:

00:

100

00:

That's totally cool, Lew. Totally cool.

101

00:

102

00:

The flight's tomorrow.

103

00:

Think about it.

104

00:

- Morning.
- Hey, good morning, man.

105

00:

- How do you feel?

- Good, good.

106

00:

So? Is it civilisation

and its discontents

107

00:

or uh... you, me and the monkeys?

108

00:

I don't think I'm cut out for that kind
of thing, Lew. That's for you, man.

109

00:

To tell you the truth...

I don't have that kind of stuff in me.

110

00:

Well, I think

you're wrong about yourself, but...

111

00:

- Give 'em hell.

- Where are you gonna go?

112

00:

New York is calling you home.

Martinis, pretty girls, the Yankees.

113

00:

Or do you want to stay here?

114

00:

Don't smoke it all in one bowl.

115

00:

You keep this. I got Tony's.

116

00:

I wouldn't take Excedrin
out of this country.

117

00:

- Why did we buy so much hash?
- At those prices we had to.

118

00:

Uh-oh.

119

00:

Well, I guess this is it, man. Yeah?

120

00:

- See ya, buddy. Good luck.
- I'm gonna miss you guys.

121

00:

Bullshit. You'll find a couple of chimps
prettier than both of us.

122

00:

You fucker.

123

00:

Take care.

124

00:

- I'll see you.

- All right.

125

00:

Safe travels.

126

00:

Yeah, Gaby, listen. Yeah.

127

00:

OK. You know what?

128

00:

No, I just, you know,

I can't talk about anything right now.

129

00:

Listen uh... No, I'm not interested
in discussing this right now.

130

00:

I got two people in the back of my car.

I'm working.

131

00:

Gaby, maybe when this shift's over,
I'll call you, we'll grab a bite, OK?

132

00:

That's my dispatcher. I gotta go.

133

00:

I gotta go. Bye.

134

00:

Yeah, it's Four, under way.

135

00:

iCan you sling a pick-up
at the Stanhope?/i

136

00:

iLady named Eastern, asked for you./i

137

00:

Eastern? Eastern, yeah.

Where's the drop at?

138

00:

iShe didn't say./i

139

00:

Fuck!

140

00:

I apologise for the sudden stop, folks,
but hopefully you were belted in.

141

00:

OK. Here we are.

142

00:

Here. Take that.

143

00:

Pleasure serving you as always,
Mr Homer.

144

00:

- This is Ravitch.
- Hey, it's Sheriff.

145

00:

How much is a famous
divorce attorney worth to you?

146

00:

He's worth squat, brother. I'm single.

147

00:

What if he's out boinking and getting
bombed and his wife's not with him?

148

00:

- That's a different story.
- Ravitch, can't you find another desk?

149

00:

- I say two bills.
- You're a cheap son of a bitch.

150

00:

- Grab a pen.
- I'm sorry.

151

00:

OK, give it to me.

152

00:

Thank you.

153

00:

We headed anywhere in particular?

154

00:

How about we just drive
around the park for a bit?

155

00:

You got it. Around the park.

156

00:

I haven't driven you before.
I never forget a face.

157

00:

Do you mind if I smoke in the car?

158

00:

It's the only place in town left
that you can smoke. Go ahead.

159

00:

So who recommended me, Miss Eastern?

160

00:

- Please call me Beth.
- OK. Who recommended me, Beth?

161

00:

- Lewis McBride.
- Lew?

162

00:

Did he say to look up old Sheriff
when you got to town?

163

00:

- How did you know where to find me?
- Lewis said you lived in Brooklyn.

164

00:

- Odds were you'd be in the book.
- Yeah, huh?

165

00:

And odds were I'd still be stuck
in Brooklyn, which obviously I am.

166

00:

So where is Lew? Is he in town here?

167

00:

Sheriff, the day you and Tony
left Penang,

168

00:

a man came looking
for a bike you guys had rented.

169

00:

He brought the police.

170

00:

Only they didn't find the bike,
but they did find 104 grams of hashish,

171

00:

some stashed in the hut,
some in the trash.

172

00:

Jesus Christ.

And Lewis caught hell for that, huh?

173

00:

Yeah. He's spent

the last two years in prison.

174

00:

Oh, my God. Jesus Christ.

175

00:

What a nightmare that must be, huh?

176

00:

Is he still in prison now?

177

00:

- For eight more days, yeah.

- I wish I'd have known sooner.

178

00:

I don't know if

I could have done anything but...

179

00:

At least he's getting out

in eight days though, huh?

180

00:

That's not the case. Anybody found
with more than 100 grams of hashish

181

00:

is considered to be trafficking.

182

00:

Trafficking?

What is that, like, dealing?

183

00:

Sheriff, in order for Lewis
not to be considered a dealer,

184

00:

you and Tony have to fly back to Penang

185

00:

and accept your share
of the responsibility.

186

00:

And what about me and Tony?
What happens to us?

187

00:

The deal was that if both of you
go back, it's three years apiece,

188

00:

and if only one of you goes back,
it's six.

189

00:

Wait. Hold on. It's three? It's six?

190

00:

Finish that sentence for me please.

191

00:

You're talking about three years
in prison. Six years in prison.

192

00:

Let me make this clear to you.

193

00:

In Malaysia, dealers get death.

194

00:

Jesus Christ,
for a shitty brick of hash?

195

00:

- So in eight days from now...
- Lewis McBride is going to hang.

196

00:

What are you, his lawyer?

197

00:

I'm his American lawyer, yeah.

198

00:

So how about we have dinner
and talk more about this?

199

00:

I can't. I'm on till 2:00.
But thank you very much.

200

00:

- Drinks then?

- At 2:

201

00:

- I want to do this more. Breakfast?

- Can't.

202

00:

- Lunch?

- I pulled a day shift.

203

00:

Let's have dinner then.

Tomorrow night. Here. Say 7:00?

204

00:

- Tomorrow at 7:

- Night.

205

00:

Thanks.

206

00:

- Excuse me, I'm looking for Tony Croft.

- Yeah, he's up top.

207

00:

Thanks.

208

00:

So if you don't go back, Tony,

Lewis will hang.

209

00:

Sorry.

210

00:

You can't come out of nowhere and tell
me the bottom's dropped out of my life

211

00:

and I've got a week
to brace for the impact.

212

00:

I'm sorry, Tony.
That's exactly what I am doing.

213

00:

I don't understand. How come it took
you guys two years to tell me this?

214

00:

Lewis never mentioned the two of you.

215

00:

Not when he was convicted two years ago,
not when he was sentenced to death.

216

00:

It was only last week when
his final pardon appeal was rejected.

217

00:

I found a detective,
the second he found you, here I am.

218

00:

You gotta understand,
this isn't just about me, all right?

219

00:

Like anybody,
I have a lot of responsibilities.

220

00:

I'm engaged. I have a fiance.

221

00:

I want to start a family.

222

00:

Family's wonderful.

223

00:

Lewis would like to have kids too.

224

00:

If you can postpone having yours
for a few years, he'll have that chance.

225

00:

I'm staying at the Stanhope.
Could you call me there tonight?

226

00:

- All right. I will.
- Thanks. Thanks, Tony.

227

00:

i- This is Beth.
- Miss Eastern? Hi. It's Tony Croft./i

228

00:

- Tony, hi.

- Listen.

229

00:

Kerrie and I talked this over
and we want to, um...

230

00:

Well, first of all I wanna say...
this is ridiculous.

231

00:

There is no way in hell
that I'll do the six years.

232

00:

But if Sheriff agrees to go back...

233

00:

Um... well, that's another...

234

00:

Uh... In that case, um... you know,
it'd be pretty hard to say no.

235

00:

Uh... OK. What you've said
has been very clear.

236

00:

I'm about to have dinner with Sheriff.
I'll call you in the morning.

237

00:

i- All right. I'll talk to you then.

- Thank you, Tony./i

238

00:

Good night.

239

00:

- Hey.

- Hi.

240

00:

- Surprised I showed?

- No. Why?

241

00:

- Cos I am.

- Eastern party?

242

00:

- Yeah.

- Right this way.

243

00:

Thanks.

244

00:

- Would you care for a cocktail?

- Glass of house red.

245

00:

- OK.

- I'll have a rum and Coke, please.

246

00:

Thank you. Reminds me of Malaysia.

Rum and Coke.

247

00:

- So have you spoken to Tony?

- Yes, I did.

248

00:

- Yeah?

- Mm-hm.

249

00:

Tony said he was going to go back.

250

00:

Yeah? Tony said he was going to call me when he got back from Penang.

251

00:

So...

252

00:

So what are you saying?

I can't count on Tony's word?

253

00:

No, I'm not saying that. Just, uh...

254

00:

I think it's good

Tony says he's going back.

255

00:

How come?

256

00:

- Because I'm...
- Excuse me. Your drinks.

257

00:

- Thanks.
- Thanks a lot.

258

00:

Tony's only going back
if you're going back.

259

00:

- You didn't say that.
- I didn't finish.

260

00:

OK, please finish then, Beth.
Finish what you were going to say.

261

00:

I don't expect you to do this
without some sort of compensation.

262

00:

Both of Lewis's parents have passed on.
They left a little something.

263

00:

How does \$50,000 sound?

264

00:

\$50,000? That sounds fine. Just fine.

265

00:

But for each year. \$50,000 a year.

266

00:

You want me to pay you \$150,000

267

00:

for assuming what is, in fact,
your share of the responsibility?

268

00:

No, not you. Lewis's estate.

I mean, they got the heavy money, right?

269

00:

You come to New York on what was
pretty much a fishing expedition.

270

00:

You stay on the Park,
eat here, not some coffee shop.

271

00:

All right.

272

00:

So I will draw up
the draft agreement tomorrow.

273

00:

If you promise me right now
that you're going to go back.

274

00:

You know what's funny to me?
Really funny?

275

00:

People like you think
you can just buy people like me.

276

00:

But guess what. I wouldn't walk
into your shit storm for any price.

277

00:

Any chance there might have been
that I'd go back

278

00:

went bye-bye
when you tried to pay me off.

279

00:

- Menus?
- I'm sorry. There's been a mistake.

280

00:

I wouldn't want you to buy me dinner.
Because then I would be exploiting you.

281

00:

Good night.

282

00:

I'm sorry. I didn't mean to insult you.

283

00:

You insulted yourself.
You made your play. We're finished.

284

00:

I would make any play to save Lewis's
life. I know you care about that.

285

00:

Don't let my nickname fool you.

286

00:

It's a bastardisation
of my name, Volgecherev.

287

00:

I keep my mouth shut and my head down.
But I do wish Lewis luck.

288

00:

I appreciate your concern for his
wellbeing. But I am persistent.

289

00:

That's great. Don't waste it on me.
You've only got a few days left.

290

00:

You're appealing to emotions I don't
have and morality I can't afford.

291

00:

That doesn't change the fact
that a man's life hangs in the balance.

292

00:

Good night.

293

00:

How're you doin', man?

What's up, Sheriff?

294

00:

How're you doin', Tony?

295

00:

Yep.

296

00:

Here we are.

297

00:

- Look, I'm freezing.

- Yeah. My secretary's out today.

298

00:

I apologise for the inconvenience.

You'll have to seat yourself.

299

00:

So this is the office, huh?

300

00:

Let's just sort this out without
that lawyer breathing down our necks.

301

00:

- She's pretty intense, huh?

- No shit, man.

302

00:

After she ambushed me,
I couldn't eat for two days.

303

00:

My girlfriend forced some toast down
my throat this morning. I threw it up.

304

00:

That's kind of a dry run for our next
three years in Penang Prison.

305

00:

So you're gonna do this?
You're going back?

306

00:

No.

307

00:

You don't give a shit, do you?

308

00:

- You think I don't care about Lewis?
- That's what you're acting like.

309

00:

You don't know
the first thing about me.

310

00:

Fine. All right. Then how come
you're so ready to slam the door on him?

311

00:

I know something
about guys who have clubs and badges.

312

00:

I've had my ass kicked by those bastards. It's not how you think.

313

00:

Doing something good doesn't mean there'll be a happy ending.

314

00:

- You could very easily die over there.

- Yeah.

315

00:

- You think of that?

- This is the other side of the coin.

316

00:

If this goes down, God forbid, and Lewis hangs,

317

00:

you don't think this is gonna be headline news?

318

00:

Sheriff, this is gonna follow you around the rest of your life.

319

00:

Whereas the other way we come home heroes and the city throws us a parade?

320

00:

Tony, you're a fucking boy scout.

You really are.

321

00:

Listen to me, OK?

322

00:

Lewis would have gone back
for either of us.

323

00:

You know that.

324

00:

That's why I'll never be mistaken
for Lewis McBride.

325

00:

- Afternoon, Miss Eastern.
- Thank you.

326

00:

iBeth Eastern? Hi. I'm MJ Major,
a reporter for the New York Examiner./i

327

00:

- You're a what?
- A reporter.

328

00:

Really? And what would you want with me?

329

00:

Come on, Beth. I know
the hanging's in less than a week.

330

00:

Press is exactly what you and the family
need for a public outcry.

331

00:

- The family wants this kept quiet.
- Really?

332

00:

In this instance, your interests and
the interests of the public converge.

333

00:

- How did you find out about this?
- My sources at the State Department.

334

00:

There's a blackout
at the State Department.

335

00:

They passed the buck.
They sold it as diplomacy.

336

00:

That's why you need me, and fast.
I can make this happen fast.

337

00:

- In 48 hours, Lewis McBride can be...
- No.

338

00:

Listen to me. Do you remember Singapore?
The American kid who graffitied a car?

339

00:

Because of the media frenzy,
they had to cane the kid.

340

00:

That was a caning.
To show some national backbone.

341

00:

- This is a hanging.
- I know that.

342

00:

Some Aussie dope dealer's mother went on
every talk show from Sydney to London.

343

00:

You know what happened? They hung
her son a week early to shut her up.

344

00:

Excuse me, I've got a really big week.

345

00:

Beth, I can make miracles happen
in a week.

346

00:

Don't do this. Don't do it.

347

00:

- Wait a minute. Why...
- What? Jesus Christ!

348

00:

I'm sorry. I'm very sorry. Just...

349

00:

Can I have that, please?

350

00:

- Is he boyish?

- What?

351

00:

Is he cute? Is he clean-cut?

352

00:

- Cos if I put him on the front page...

- Give me some time.

353

00:

Give me some time, some space,
and I'll give you your story.

354

00:

When?

355

00:

Soon.

356

00:

I'm gonna call you, Beth.

357

00:

What are you doing here?

358

00:

- I have a tape I want you to watch.

- Yeah?

359

00:

Jesus Christ, you don't let up, do you?

360

00:

- I can't.

- You know what? I'm gonna watch this.

361

00:

Honest to God I am. But I was actually gonna go get something to eat.

362

00:

So I'll watch it later.

363

00:

Are you inviting me to dinner,
or are we still mad at each other?

364

00:

Both.

365

00:

- Cheers.

- Cheers.

366

00:

It's a toast to Lewis.

367

00:

Sweet guy. Loved the animals.

Loved his beer.

368

00:

- Did he?

- He did.

369

00:

I never knew that about him.

370

00:

Tell me something else.

371

00:

- Beer is all I really remember.

- That's it?

372

00:

- Yeah.

- Wow.

373

00:

- He didn't leave an impression then.

- Lewis? Are you kidding me?

374

00:

- Have you spent a lot of time with him?

- I've never had a beer with him.

375

00:

He is, honestly, Beth, one
of the sweetest people I've ever met.

376

00:

Lewis is the kind of guy...

You'd have a beggar on the street,

377

00:

and he'd just...
he'd touch them somehow, talk to them.
378

00:
The guy could have an illness,
language barrier, whatever it was.
379

00:
He just could see people, I guess.
380

00:
Got a big heart.
381

00:
Yeah. That's nice.
382

00:
What else can you tell me about him?
383

00:
You are good, aren't you?
384

00:
Oh, Sheriff, what do you think about me?
385

00:
I don't know.
386

00:
You seem to think I have
all these wiles and stratagems.
387

00:
I don't.

388

00:

I have a man's life in my hands.

389

00:

I get that.

390

00:

But let me ask you a question, Beth.

391

00:

And ask yourself this honestly.

392

00:

Would you go back?

393

00:

I wouldn't ask you or Tony to do this

394

00:

if I hadn't already
answered the question for myself.

395

00:

Yeah.

396

00:

But I guess, you know, I don't think
you could ever honestly answer that

397

00:

unless you were
in that situation yourself.

398

00:

- Hi, Gaby.

- I'm not a piece of dirt you get off on

399

00:

then flush down the john, all right?

400

00:

He'll fuck you and then sneak out,

by the fire escape if he has to.

401

00:

Unless you don't give a shit.

Unless you're some whore.

402

00:

I'm his wife.

403

00:

What?

404

00:

Fuck you for not wearing a ring.

405

00:

That's my friend Gaby.

406

00:

Wow. Good thing you didn't give her

a social disease. We'd all be dead.

407

00:

- Thanks, Frank. I appreciate it.

- So when did you guys tie the knot?

408

00:

You know what, Frank?
Get the hell outta here, will you?

409

00:

- OK?
- Yeah.

410

00:

- Well, that was fun.
- That was something.

411

00:

"I'm his wife. " I like that one.
"I'm his wife. "

412

00:

Thanks. You left this on the table.

413

00:

- Please watch it.
- I will, Beth. I will.

414

00:

Good night.

415

00:

OK.

416

00:

iOK, Lewis, go ahead./i

417

00:

iUm... Hey, guys./i

418

00:

iSheriff. Tony./i

419

00:

iLong time, huh?/i

420

00:

iI guess if you're seeing this tape/i

421

00:

iyou've kind of figured
that my vacation plans... changed./i

422

00:

iI was set to go off/i

423

00:

iand try and save the orang-utan,
do what I can./i

424

00:

iKind of ironic, isn't it?/i

425

00:

iLook who's caged and.../i

426

00:

ithey say soon to be extinct./i

427

00:

iUm... this little docudrama here/i

428

00:

iwas not my idea./i

429

00:

iI'm sorry, but, um.../i

430

00:

ithe folks

at the American Citizen Service/i

431

00:

ihave done all they can/i

432

00:

iand now they tell me

that you guys are my last chance./i

433

00:

iSo.../i

434

00:

iI don't know if you're even thinking
about coming back./i

435

00:

iBut if there's the slightest chance,
I will tell you this./i

436

00:

iUm... I haven't been. uh.../i

437

00:

iharmed in any way./i

438

00:

iI haven't been tortured.../i

439

00:

iexcept by boredom and hunger./i

440

00:

iThere's not a whole lot
of good stuff to eat./i

441

00:

iNo burgers for you, Sheriff. But, uh.../i

442

00:

iThere's rice. Plenty of rice.
Your rice needs definitely will be met./i

iBut, um.../i

444

00:

iIf you do.../i

445

00:

iIf you do come back,/i

446

00:

iI will feel guilty, yes,/i

447

00:

iand... I already do,
just for asking you./i

448

00:

iBut.../i

449

00:

iat least I won't feel the fear,
and I know that's not fair./i

450

00:

iUm.../i

451

00:

iso that's why I'm doing this./i

452

- Hey!

- I'm busy!

453

00:

- Can't take you today.

- Yeah, well, I can't take you either.

454

00:

Pop, remember that trip I took
a couple of years back, to Malaysia?

455

00:

Yeah, I remember. Some sleaze was
selling frequent-flyer miles, right?

456

00:

That's not the point. The point is
this guy is still over there in Penang.

457

00:

He's kind of a pal.

But anyway, they're gonna hang him.

458

00:

They found some hashish on him.

But some of the hash was mine.

459

00:

So if I go back there,

460

00:

I'd have to serve

three years in prison, Penang Prison.

461

00:

But if I don't go back,

they hang this guy.

462

00:

They don't hang guys for hashish.

I'm not that naive.

463

00:

You're leaving something out.

464

00:

I'm not leaving anything out, Dad.

That's the way it is over there.

465

00:

All right. So maybe you're right

and I'm wrong.

466

00:

You still want my advice

in this hanging stuff?

467

00:

- Yeah.

- It feels like an easy call.

468

00:

If you weren't wasting your life here,
it might be different.

469

00:

But this pal you'll save,

470

00:

odds are he's worth more than you.

471

00:

So my advice, you go, you do the time.

472

00:

What's the matter? You look sick.

473

00:

You're my dad. You're supposed to
beg me not to go back.

474

00:

It's just not
what I expected to hear, I guess.

475

00:

Lighten up. I'm just yanking your crank.

476

00:

Why put yourself through the agony

when you know you're not going?

477

00:

I mean, who's kidding who?

What are we, suckers here?

478

00:

No, they did what?

479

00:

They weighed him?

480

00:

For what?

481

00:

Jesus.

482

00:

Uh...

483

00:

Uh... I... I have to get my other...

I have to get the call.

484

00:

Um...

485

00:

It might be one of the guys.

We'll talk tomorrow?

486

00:

Um... This... this is Beth.

487

00:

Beth, hi. You sound stressed.
This is MJ Major.

488

00:

iIs this a bad time?/i

489

00:

No. No, it's not a bad time.

490

00:

Beth, what's wrong? How can I help?

491

00:

You know... You want to know
how you can help?

492

00:

Just leave me alone, MJ.
Just leave me alone.

493

00:

I've got the resources to a daily paper
with worldwide readership.

494

00:

iWe are picked up
by the International Herald Trib./i

495

00:

We could be doing anything you want.
Photographs, articles, petitions...

496

00:

Every single one a death warrant, MJ.

A death warrant.

497

00:

Now, I've asked you nicely to stay out
of this until after the hearing.

498

00:

If I don't get something from you
soon, I'll go straight to your two guys.

499

00:

You don't know who they are,
or you'd already be there.

500

00:

I'm hanging up.

501

00:

Beth, I'm gonna need
to hear from you very soon.

502

00:

You will.

503

00:

Sheriff. Well, hi.

504

00:

I didn't expect to see you. Come on in.

505

00:

Thanks. How are you doing?

506

00:

- Couldn't be better.

- Yeah?

507

00:

Please give me some good news.

508

00:

Are you, um...

Did you get my message about dinner?

509

00:

Yeah, I got your message

but I can't make dinner. I got plans.

510

00:

But I did want

to return this to you. The tape.

511

00:

Uh... OK.

512

00:

- Did you watch it?

- Yeah, I watched the whole thing.

513

00:

And, um...

514

00:

I did a lot of soul-searching

last night with this.

515

00:

And I figure you've got
to know sooner than later
516

00:
because of everything.
517

00:
I just wanted to come and let you know
where you stand with me.
518

00:
That's good.
519

00:
Where do I stand with you?
520

00:
I talked to Tony and he said...
He's halfway to Penang already.
521

00:
I think he just needs a nudge.
I think he'll probably go back.
522

00:
But, um...
523

00:
You know, I looked inside,
deep inside, Beth,
524

00:
to find something, but, uh...
525

00:
it isn't in me.
526

00:
Oh, it isn't... in you.
527

00:
Jot that down. Do me a favour? Write
that down for me. Just a few words.
528

00:
I'd love to give them to Lew
before he hangs. Letter from a pal.
529

00:
Listen, I... "Searched my soul"
was the best part for me.
530

00:
I don't know. That's great.
531

00:
He'd love to know that you searched
your soul before you decided not to go.
532

00:
Yeah.
533

00:
They just told me
that they weighed Lewis today
534

00:
for the trap doors of the gallows.
535

00:

- Beth...

- Get out of here.

536

00:

Get the fuck out of here, Sheriff.

537

00:

- Sheriff is here.

- What do you say? How're you doing?

538

00:

- I thought you had plans.

- I did. A thing at Lincoln Center.

539

00:

You know what I mean? But here I am.

Ready to discuss. What did I order?

540

00:

Sheriff, this is Kerrie, my fiance.

Kerrie, John Volgecherev.

541

00:

Kerrie, nice to meet you.

542

00:

You're not as platinum

as I expected you to be.

543

00:

Listen, Sheriff...

544

00:

It's pretty obvious that you have
no intention of going back, right?

545

00:

Where?

546

00:

- Is he drunk?

- Oh, you mean, like, back to prison.

547

00:

Right, well, I've never actually been.

548

00:

Do you have a fork I could use?

549

00:

I've never been to prison, thus, I can't
go back to somewhere I've never been.

550

00:

Thank you.

That is brilliantly unhelpful.

551

00:

- Yes.

- Beth, I checked.

552

00:

Penang Prison is at a third-world level
of sanitation, nutrition,

553

00:

rice rations don't meet minimum...

554

00:

Lewis is provided with food from Amnesty International. So would Tony be.

555

00:

- Inmates have been tortured.
- He hasn't been.

556

00:

- Inmates have died of typhus.
- Because of overcrowding.

557

00:

Lewis has his own cell, as would Tony, and Sheriff if he goes back.

558

00:

That's really good. And the other thing I think you've overlooked

559

00:

is that that building's not up to code.

560

00:

- Oh, Jesus.
- What are you, the class clown?

561

00:

And who are you to tell them to give up their freedom?

562

00:

I represent a boy sentenced to death.

563

00:

Right. For the sake of some client,
you demand...

564

00:

Demand? No, no, no. I don't demand.
I have not demanded anything.

565

00:

...that they endure three or six years
of God knows what. That's insane.

566

00:

Yeah, it's insane, OK?

567

00:

- I'm gonna go back.
- What?

568

00:

OK?

569

00:

I'm sorry, honey.

570

00:

In the middle of this, what matters?

571

00:

That Lewis doesn't die.
Somebody's got to do something. Please.

572

00:

Where's the document
that guarantees this deal?

573

00:

The Attorney General of Malaysia
has agreed...

574

00:

So where is it?
Why don't we have a copy?

575

00:

- It's an oral agreement.
- No.

576

00:

Tony goes nowhere
till we have that document.

577

00:

They don't work that way.
I wish they did.

578

00:

I cannot get anything to you in writing.

579

00:

Don't.

580

00:

I'll be at home if you want me.

581

00:

Sorry, Tony. I'm sorry.

582

00:

She's just scared, all right?

She's more scared than I am.

583

00:

You're gonna have to excuse me.

584

00:

If I'm gonna get her
to wait three years for me...

585

00:

I guess six...

586

00:

I shouldn't keep her waiting tonight.

587

00:

Tony, what can I say? Thank you.

588

00:

Sure.

589

00:

All right, Tony.

590

00:

- See you, man.
- See you later. Good luck with that.

591

00:

Right, Sheriff.
I'll go talk to the firm.

592

00:

Well, quite a party.

593

00:

- Are you gonna go back to your hotel?

- Oh, yes.

594

00:

Gotta call Penang.

Give them the good news.

595

00:

So I guess Lew's gonna be OK then, huh?

596

00:

Which means, you know...

597

00:

You're off the hook?

598

00:

- I'm off the hook, huh?

- Good night.

599

00:

Jaffe, I want a follow-up
on the Canarsie fire.

600

00:

- Nice of you to join us, Ravitch.

- It's my pleasure.

601

00:

I'd like some pictures
of the shopkeeper, burnt out.

602

00:

You got it.

603

00:

MJ, where's my pension fund fraud?

604

00:

I thought you had a CPA
who was ready to talk.

605

00:

I did. And she's given me gold.

606

00:

I'm just fact-checking a few points.

607

00:

And I'm looking for a source
called Sheriff.

608

00:

Ring anybody's bell? Sheriff?

609

00:

OK. Let's go, then.

610

00:

i- Yeah?

- Hi. It's Beth./i

611

00:

I talked to the garage
and they said you called in sick.

612

00:

i- Can I come up and see you?

- Uh... sure./i

613

00:

- Hi.

- Hi there.

614

00:

- Hi there.

- I brought some goodies from Zabar's.

615

00:

Jewish penicillin. Cure you right up.

616

00:

Isn't that nice? Should I beware
of lawyers bearing gifts?

617

00:

Think I'm gonna have a beer.

Do you want one?

618

00:

Uh... beer? Sure.

619

00:

You're quite the avid reader,
aren't you?

620

00:

- Or is this just...

- Yeah, just for showing off.

621

00:

All the visitors I have. I keep my place
real impressive, don't I?

622

00:

It's nice.

623

00:

The books are a recent development.

624

00:

When I was in school,
I tried to avoid reading.

625

00:

Then I graduate
and realise I don't know shit.

626

00:

- Yeah. Who does?
- You know what I mean?

627

00:

So anyway,
I start getting the books and...

628

00:

do some reading,
learn about the world around me.

629

00:

Just trying to be civilised
I guess, Beth.

630

00:

That's good. Lewis said you were better than you thought you were.

631

00:

A lot of them are pop-up books. Colouring. That kind of thing.

632

00:

Where's your passport?

633

00:

- What?

- I just want to see your passport.

634

00:

In case it's not good. I can renew it tomorrow on an emergency basis

635

00:

if you decide something different.

636

00:

So when you said about me being off the hook, you were just lying to my face?

637

00:

I think you were lying to yourself.

638

00:

Come on, Sheriff. Only a total bastard would let Tony go back alone.

639

00:

Yeah, well, I'm not in charge of Tony.

640

00:

- I'm not his dad.

- I know that.

641

00:

But Tony's a man who's got...

Tony's a great guy.

642

00:

But he's got a future

and a sexy fiance.

643

00:

Yeah.

644

00:

Six years under any circumstances

would be hard as hell,

645

00:

but this case, it's inconceivable.

646

00:

I think Tony's a man of his word.

647

00:

Tony called me three days ago and

told me that he couldn't do six years.

648

00:

I know what he said last night.

I applaud his idealism.

649

00:

But... I can't count on it.

650

01:

I have to have you
on that plane, Sheriff.

651

01:

Please show me your passport.

652

01:

No that it's any of your business,
but my passport's good.

653

01:

- It is? Show it to me.
- Take my word for it.

654

01:

Show it to me.

655

01:

You'd take three years from me
but you wouldn't take my word?

656

01:

OK. All right. I pushed it. I'm sorry.

657

01:

I trust you.

658

01:

You know what?

659

01:

Come on. You're gonna go for me
if you don't have a client?

660

01:

What are you talking about? Wh... What?

661

01:

You offer me money and I don't take that

662

01:

so you figure, "Why don't I fuck the guy
cos then he'll do what I want. "

663

01:

That's exactly me.

That's actually exactly me.

664

01:

I'll get you to go back because

I'll give you a little sex. That's me.

665

01:

- Go fuck yourself.

- Whoo!

666

01:

That's fun. I'm the guy

who's gotta clean up. That's fun.

667

01:

- Have fun, Sheriff.

- Shut up! You're too noisy!

668

01:

You fucking crazy bastard!

669

01:

Shut up! You're making
too much goddamn noise!

670

01:

Open the door! Open the door, you
fucking pussy! Open the fucking door!

671

01:

- Open your fucking door!
- Sheriff, that's enough!

672

01:

- I'm calling the cops.
- Sheriff.

673

01:

Turnabout's fair game, huh?
Now that you're news, all's fair.

674

01:

You son of a bitch!
Taking pictures of me?

675

01:

- I'll bust your fucking face open!
- I'm doing my job, man.

676

01:

- I'm doing my job! I'm doing my job!
- Get the fuck outta my face.

677

01:

I'll sue your ass.

678

01:

Sheriff!

679

01:

Sheriff, can I talk to you
for one second? Please?

680

01:

- Is that your photographer?
- Is that Sheriff?

681

01:

Are you gonna print pictures now?

682

01:

This story is about
to blow wide open, OK?

683

01:

I found this story first,
I'm gonna print it first, period.

684

01:

Your story could cost Lewis's life.
Do you understand that?

685

01:

You give me three days - three days -
until the hearing is over, OK?

686

01:

You promise me
that you will not talk to a soul

687

01:
and that I have Lewis exclusively.
688

01:
Exclusive.
689

01:
You promise me
you're gonna hold off on the story.
690

01:
Three days, Beth.
691

01:
Slow down, driver.
You're making me nervous.
692

01:
I'm sorry, sir. It's a bad habit I got.
693

01:
I was all mellowed out
but you fucked that up.
694

01:
I hope you're not gonna say
I can't smoke.
695

01:
It's the only place left in town
you can smoke.
696

01:
What the fuck are you doing?

Smoking crack?

697

01:

Crack is for
our African-American brethren.

698

01:

This is pure rock cocaine.

699

01:

If you don't like it, driver,
you can raise the partition.

700

01:

- I can?
- Whatever you want to do.

701

01:

You want to see what I want to do?

702

01:

Huh?

703

01:

Cocksucker.

704

01:

What do you want?

705

01:

I want to see you.

706

01:

OK.

707

01:

What's happening here, Beth?

708

01:

You tell me, Sheriff.

709

01:

I'm not sure but I know that I just...

710

01:

I can't take this any more.

711

01:

So don't take it.

712

01:

What do you want?

713

01:

Oh, my God.

714

01:

You're killing me, Beth.

715

01:

I'm killing you?

716

01:

You're killing me.

717

01:

Sheriff?

718

01:

Oh, shit.

719

01:

Sheriff, are you there?

720

01:

I was just gonna say
that I hope that, um...

721

01:

you don't think last night was about...

722

01:

Um... could you call me
when you get this message?

723

01:

That'd be good. All right.

724

01:

Can I sit next to you on the plane?

725

01:

Hi, Tony. Tony?

726

01:

- Hm?

- You all right?

727

01:

- Yeah. Yeah, I'm fine.

- Sure?

728

01:

Do you wanna, um...

Do you want to switch with us?

729

01:

- Yeah, do you want to switch seats?

- No, I like my seat. It's fine.

730

01:

Sheriff, I'm a big boy.

I don't need somebody to hold my hand.

731

01:

- OK.

- All right.

732

01:

At least until we

get over the Philippines.

733

01:

Come on, move it, man! Let's go!

734

01:

- Whoo!

- Look out!

735

01:

Woo-hoo! Yes!

736

01:

Maybe we should all wash up,

meet in a half hour or so.

737

01:

Fine with me.

738

01:

- Is that cool with everyone?

- Yeah, it's fine.

739

01:

- I'm right here.

- All right, man.

740

01:

Hi.

741

01:

Sheriff...

742

01:

What's the matter? What's wrong?

743

01:

Um...

744

01:

What?

745

01:

I'm gonna miss you.

746

01:

I'm gonna miss you.

747

01:

They won't bend.

Only one visitor allowed in there.

748

01:

- One at a time?

- No, only one today.

749

01:

- Oh, great.

- What do you want to do?

750

01:

Do you mind

if I go back there and see him?

751

01:

- No. No, you go.

- Are you sure?

752

01:

Go ahead.

753

01:

- Tell him I'll see him soon.

- OK.

754

01:

Can you come back here?

755

01:

I hear you.

756

01:

Lew?

757

01:

Lewis?

758

01:

- Sheriff?

- Yeah.

759

01:

Didn't they tell you I was coming?

760

01:

I was praying.

I thought you were a dream

761

01:

cos no prayer of mine's

ever been answered here before.

762

01:

Yeah? I sure as hell ain't a dream.

I'll tell you that.

763

01:

It's good to see you.

764

01:

- It's good to see you.

- You too!

765

01:

- How are you, man?

- I'm better now.

766

01:

That's good. That's good.

767

01:

- How are you?

- I'm all right, man.

768

01:

- You look good. Nice. Nice.

- Spiff on.

769

01:

You've come so far. Are you thirsty?

Do you want some tea?

770

01:

- I can make some tea.

- All right. Yeah. Let's have some tea.

771

01:

- It's not warm or anything but...

- It's OK.

772

01:

- You're not cold, are you?

- Nah, I'm not cold.

773

01:

No?

774

01:

Tony is here to see you too.

He's outside.

775

01:

- You see, they took away my blanket.

- Why did they take your blanket away?

776

01:

Cos they were scared that I was gonna
tear it into strips to hang myself.

777

01:

I said, "Hey, guys, what do you think
I'm paying you for?"

778

01:

Thank you, man. That's good tea.

779

01:

I know why Tony didn't come in here.

780

01:

I know. Cos there's no God in here.

781

01:

They only let one visitor in at a time.

782

01:

That's why I pray now, Sheriff.

783

01:

I... Cos...

784

01:

Out there there's no need to... to pray

785

01:

where-where-where God's hand is felt.

786

01:

You know? Where God is apparent?

787

01:

But in here there's definitely a need

788

01:

to-to pray, t-t-t-to beg,

to plead, to sing

789

01:

for... for a sign like...

790

01:

You know how... You know how...

791

01:

how your voice sounds so pretty

792

01:

in the shower?

793

01:

Because... because

there's nothing else there.

794

01:

Because it echoes off the walls

and it sounds so pretty.

795

01:

That's why prayer sounds so perfect

in here.

796

01:

Because it's so...

Because it's so totally empty.

797

01:

Because it's so... it's so godless.

798

01:

It's... It's so void of...

of anything.

799

01:

And do you know how I know, Sheriff?

Do you know how I know?

800

01:

I know because...

801

01:

because I... I ask myself...

802

01:

would I come back for you?

803

01:

And the only answer

804

01:

is a godless empty evil "No. "

805

01:

I'm sorry

I wouldn't have come back!

806

01:

- I'm sorry.
- Don't be. It's OK.

807

01:

Because I didn't come back just for you.

808

01:

I didn't come back just for you,
you know?

809

01:

It's all right. Man, it's OK.

810

01:

Do you know what I mean? Come here.

811

01:

It's OK.

812

01:

- OK, man.
- OK.

813

01:

I'm gonna see you in a couple hours,
all right? All right?

814

01:

Thanks for the tea. I liked that.

815

01:

See you in a couple of hours.
You'll be cleaned up. It'll be good.

816

01:

Sheriff.

817

01:

Yeah?

818

01:

I knew you'd come back.

819

01:

Even if you didn't.

820

01:

Thank you.

821

01:

So how bad was it?

822

01:

I don't know. I don't know
how bad it was. It was not good.

823

01:

What wasn't good, the prison or Lewis?

824

01:

The prison sucks, for sure. It's dirty,
it's scary, it's third-world.

825

01:

How's Lewis? Is he sick?

826

01:

Is he all there mentally?

Is he the same guy we used to know?

827

01:

I don't think he's lost his mind,

828

01:

but it's not easy sitting around a cell
waiting to hang.

829

01:

Yeah. What did he say?

Did he tell you anything?

830

01:

He just babbled a little bit, Tone.

831

01:

You know, like,

rambled a little bit, you know?

832

01:

Like stream-of-consciousness stuff.

833

01:

God's not in here.

There's no God in here.

834

01:

The sound's beautiful,
like singing in the shower.

835

01:

Basically you're saying he lost it.

836

01:

He's hanging onto anything
he possibly can.

837

01:

- No one's questioning his courage.
- But his sanity?

838

01:

You want a way out? Find one.
But Lewis has always talked that way.

839

01:

How do... What do you mean, always?

840

01:

You're only his lawyer.
You've known him for two years.

841

01:

24 years.

842

01:

- I'm his sister.
- What?

843

01:

He's my baby brother.

844

01:

Why didn't you tell me?

845

01:

I thought you wouldn't trust me,
Sheriff.

846

01:

I thought you'd think
I'd do anything, that I'd say...

847

01:

say anything,
that I'd sell you out, that I'd...

848

01:

I wanted to... I wanted to tell you.
I tried to tell you.

849

01:

But you didn't tell me.

850

01:

But you didn't tell me.

851

01:

Sheriff?

852

01:

What are we still doing here?

853

01:

I wish it was that simple, Tony.

854

01:

I think it's that simple.

855

01:

I came back here based on
what she told me, OK,
856

01:
and she gave me her word and she lied.
857

01:
How are we going to trust her, Sheriff?
858

01:
She drags us into this nightmare, we
find out it is her personal nightmare.
859

01:
A woman we don't know from Adam.
I don't know her. You don't know her.
860

01:
- What?
- I know her.
861

01:
Like, know her.
862

01:
Don't even... Don't.
863

01:
Fuck.
864

01:
All right, I'm an asshole.
865

01:

No, Tony.

This time I'm the fucking asshole.

866

01:

Why didn't you tell me?

867

01:

What do I owe you to tell you that? It's not like it's been going on forever.

868

01:

- It happened.

- Listen to me...

869

01:

Don't make it like I'm holding out on you because I swear to God I'm not.

870

01:

All right. Listen to me, Sheriff.

871

01:

This girl will do anything to get you to do what she needs you to, all right?

872

01:

That's her brother in there. Her blood.

873

01:

She'll lie to you, she'll sleep with you, she'll tell you she loves you.

874

01:

She'll do anything. She'll get down on her knees and beg you.

875

01:

But don't believe it. It's a setup.

876

01:

If we walk out of here, that boy hangs.

877

01:

And if we stay maybe we hang.

But if we leave, we live.

878

01:

That's the one thing

I know for sure right now.

879

01:

He doesn't have clothes?

880

01:

Can't you give him a shower

before he turns up in court?

881

01:

OK. Listen. I...

882

01:

What can I do for you, sir?

883

01:

We need two seats on any flight

to New York, as fast as possible.

884

01:

What, Sheriff? What is it?

885

01:

I trashed that bike, Tony.

886

01:

So fucking what?

Get on the plane, Sheriff.

887

01:

Do you want to rot

in one of these prisons?

888

01:

- I'm gonna take my chances, Tony.

- You don't have any chances, Sheriff.

889

01:

Don't leave your life to fate.

This is stupid.

890

01:

I don't know, Tony.

891

01:

You have a safe flight.

892

01:

- What's he saying?

- He says they returned

893

01:

but became frightened and may have left.

894

01:

We request adjournment
till the two can be found.

895

01:

Um... he's worried about the appearance
of preferential treatment.

896

01:

Hey, Lew. How are you?

897

01:

My faith in humanity
is half restored.

898

01:

In returning voluntarily, you are
to be commended for your courage.

899

01:

Is there anything you wish to say
to this court, Mr Volgecherev?

900

01:

Not really, Your Honour.

901

01:

Just that we were young and stupid,
I guess.

902

01:

But not evil.

903

01:

I didn't come back here today
because I'm courageous.

904

01:

I came back here because
I've been careless for a very long time,
905

01:

and I'm sick of that feeling.
906

01:

The simple fact, Your Honour,
is that I am responsible.
907

01:

And I'm also scared.
908

01:

But I am willing to do
whatever is necessary...
909

01:

in order for you
to spare my friend's life.
910

01:

How do you plead?
911

01:

I'm guilty.
912

01:

You will be detained in Penang Prison
to await sentence.
913

01:

He asked the prosecutor
if he will now reduce the charges.

914

01:

The prosecutor has agreed.

915

01:

Chief Justice will be back
shortly with his decision.

916

01:

Beth?

917

01:

We're back in session.

918

01:

- We're back?

- Yeah.

919

01:

The Deputy Home Minister is angered
about some international news story.

920

01:

I'm not sure what.

921

01:

iA story that was picked up
by the Asian International Tribune./i

922

01:

"In a country proud of its many species
of exotic butterflies,

923

01:
a butterfly is
about to be broken on a wheel. "
924

01:
"The wheel is Malaysian justice,
925

01:
a term which strikes one
American woman as a cruel joke."
926

01:
- Your Honour...
- "The woman is Beth McBride..."
927

01:
- I didn't do this.
- "... whose brother was arrested
928

01:
two years ago in Penang."
929

01:
"Blamed for having bought
hashish with two friends,
930

01:
this nature-loving young man now,
incredibly, faces death. "
931

01:
- She was determined to write the story.
- Silence!
932

01:

We know you westerners don't understand
our attitude toward drugs.

933

01:

But we don't understand yours.

934

01:

Your cities are decaying, the souls of
your young people are stolen from you.

935

01:

Our laws may seem harsh but our streets
remain safe and our youth is protected.

936

01:

So when an American journalist
criticises ourjudicial system...

937

01:

- Your Honour, I begged her not to.
- Silence!

938

01:
