THE ASSASSINATION

Sarajevo, 1914

Herr Pfeffer, did you hear what  
happened?

A bomb was thrown  
at the imperial car.

It exploded under the car.

Lieutenant Colonel Merizzi  
was slightly injured.

Has the perpetrator been arrested?

- They wanted to lynch him.

But he was arrested,  
they want you to interrogate him.

Who wants that?

- Councillor Fiedler.

The heir apparent is outraged,  
he wants to know who's behind it.

Why is he so wet?

- He jumped into the Miljacka River.

He wanted to die,  
but it wasn't deep enough.

What's his name?

- Don't know.

Do you speak German?

What is your name?

He was wounded in the mouth, he  
probably wanted to swallow poison

Can you write?

Give me a pencil and paper.

If you can't talk, then  
write your name and age.

Nedeljko abrinovi, nineteen.

Let Dr. Sattler have a look at him,  
then I'll question him.

Leo.

- Hi, Herbert.

He injured his hands,  
and broke two ribs.

I treated the wounds.  
He thinks he's invulnerable.  
- Who?  
Franz Ferdinand. He was warned.  
Yesterday at dinner.  
Count Harrach said it was dangerous.  
You know what he said?  
Our life is always in danger.  
We must trust God.  
God will protect him.  
What kind of poison did abrinovi  
ingest?  
Cyanide I think,  
but it was too old.  
So I can interrogate him?  
Many bi-standers were hit by  
bomb-splinters.  
Where were you?  
- On the way.  
Didn't you want to cheer?  
- Nobody missed me, I guess.  
I'll see you tonight?  
- If it's resolved.  
You are a Bosnian Serb.  
They found your passport.  
You came from Belgrade.  
What did you do there?  
Do you want to destroy Serbia?  
Or us all together?  
Answer, please.  
You injured people,  
have the courage to answer.  
Who gave you the bomb?  
Talking isn't your forte, huh?  
You'd prefer to to talk  
about belief, then you're blind.  
Like you.  
- Excuse me?  
The Emperor is good, the people  
love him.  
And Austria too.  
That's what you believe.  
Who ordered you to throw the bomb?  
Someone shot His Imperial Highness

and the Duchess.

When?

- Ten minutes ago.

Another attack?

They were taken to the Konak Hotel.

Excuse me.

Herr Pfeffer?

Frulein Jeftanovi,

what are you doing here?

I'm looking for my father. He wanted to go to the reception for the heir apparent...

but they wouldn't let me in

- he accompanied him?

I don't know, we put our car at his disposal.

I'll inform you immediately when I know more.

Please go home.

Councillor Fiedler?

The Duchess is on her way here, dead.

His Imperial Highness

bled to death at her side.

Governor Potiorek wants to see you in his office in about 20 minutes.

Herbert?

What are you doing here?

I have to prepare the bodies for the trip back to Vienna, their physician can't do it.

So that the duke and duchess don't rot.

Five litres of formaldehyde in the carotid artery.

His trust in God didn't protect him.

Governor Potiorek is waiting for you.

Herr Pfeffer.

Sit down.

Do you know what happened?

- Not quite.

They threw a bomb at him.

It bounced off his arm

when he wanted to protect his wife.

It exploded under Merizzi's car.

- Luckily, the driver sped off.

He drove us to the city hall.

- Us?

I was in the car with His Imperial Highness. He was furious.

Someone dared throw a bomb at him.

So he was safe at the city hall?

For a while. But he wanted to

visit Merizzi.

So we drove away.

What could we do?

I don't understand very well.

- What don't you understand?

Who drove away again, and where?

- Everyone went to the hospital.

Merizzi was hit by a bomb splinter in the first attack.

He was in the military hospital.

- That's on the other side of town.

Was His Highness advised to drive along the Appel-Quay again?

They could walk with difficulty.

What happened?

A Serbian popped up and shot directly at them.

Duchess von Hohenberg

was hit. In the abdomen.

"Sophie, don't die, stay alive for our children," he shouted.

The second bullet hit him in the neck.

He even said it was nothing.

Then he lost consciousness.

God rest his soul.

The bomber tried to commit suicide.

But he was arrested.

So the Serbs want war.

Of course, the Serbian government is behind it.

And you will prove that.

After a thorough investigation.

We can't invade Serbia right away.

And the Emperor needs time to consult the Germans.

Krner, the report.

His Excellency drafted a report.

As an eyewitness.

You'll head up the investigation.  
And Vienna then?  
Won't they send someone?  
That's not necessary. You can do it.  
Can I interrogate the occupants  
of the other cars?  
No, they departed today in the train.  
You'll receive their written statements.  
We must bring the attackers to justice.  
Find out which Serbs were behind it.  
Vienna already knows you're working on it.  
Another question. Marija Jeftanovi  
wants to know where her father is.  
He put his car at their disposal  
for the visit.  
Stojan Jeftanovi, the wealthy Serbian?  
He was sent home.  
After the investigation he'll get  
his car back.  
Stay away from those people,  
times are changing.  
Your report is expected as soon  
as possible.  
I'm Leo Pfeffer. What is your name?  
Princip.  
- And what else?  
Gavrilo.  
- How old are you?  
Nineteen.  
You were born in Sarajevo?  
- No, in the west, in Obljaj.  
What is your occupation?  
- Student, I'm at the gymnasium.  
Tell me what happened.  
Where were you? On the quay?  
Show me the spot.  
At the Latin Bridge, here.  
Why?  
Your accomplice wanted to kill  
Franz Ferdinand, but you stood there.  
As if nailed to the ground  
- No, I was already in the cafe.  
But then they came back.  
The whole convoy.

Did you shoot right away?  
They turned into the street and  
stopped right in front of me.  
Where?  
Here.  
Their car drove down the street  
and stopped right in front of you?  
I committed no crime.  
I killed a tyrant.  
Austria-Hungary suppresses all the  
Serbs in Bosnia and Herzegovina.  
Why did you shoot Duchess  
von Hohenberg? A woman?  
Is she dead?  
I can't focus very well.  
I didn't want to hurt her.  
I'm sorry.  
How many of you are there?  
Do you speak our language?  
- I come from Osijek.  
That's why did they chose you  
because you're a Slav.  
I'm an Austrian, just like you.  
How do you know Nedeljko abrinovi?  
Who helped you?  
Or did two nineteen year olds  
plan this together?  
Who gave you the weapons?  
Tell me.  
Strametz, take him to his cell.  
His Highness wanted to go to the  
hospital to see Merizzi.  
The hospital is here.  
Why did you turn the corner here?  
The driver of the first car  
didn't know about the new route.  
What's that?  
- The murder weapon, a Browning.  
Let Strametz do his job.  
One night with us does wonders.  
Princip must have stayed somewhere.  
Check the registers.  
Arrest those who live there.  
abrinovi's father has a guest

house here in Sarajevo.

I often eat there.

- Have him arrested too.

The father, and all the extended family.

What do you want? - Pfeffer,

I want to speak to Marija Jeftanovi.

Herr Pfeffer.

- Hopefully I didn't come at a bad time.

Is your father okay?

- Yes, thank you.

Your car will be returned after  
the investigation.

I hope that's not a big problem.

- Was it the Serbs?

I don't know, the investigation  
will determine that.

Are you in charge?

That's a significant task.

I believe she was very nice.

The Duchess.

Yesterday we had tea together  
at the Spa Hotel.

They were staying there.

My father was expecting a lot  
from Franz Ferdinand.

He thought, as Emperor, he would make  
the Slavs equals to the Hungarians.

Can I speak to your father officially?

He's already gone to bed.

The events had quite an effect on him.

Can I come back tomorrow?

- Please, do so.

What's happening here?

They're expelling the Serbs.

- Why don't you stop them?

I only have 36 men, can I protect  
the city like that?

Use the Bosnian state police.

- They were sent home yesterday.

Was there no gendarmerie  
here for the visit?

Where was the army?

- In their barracks.

And how many police were there?



- All 36

Was the route secured with 36 men?

I told them it was too few.

There are riots throughout the city.

Be careful.

Greetings. And?

The corpses will be taken by train

to the "Viribus Unitis" tomorrow.

The ship will take them to Trieste.

It's almost romantic.

A beer?

- Please.

Do you know Stojan Jeftanovi?

- Yes.

He supplies food to the army,

he got rich from that.

But that's all over now.

- Why?

The Army cancelled all the contracts

because he's a Serb.

How do you know?

I treat his ulcer.

This won't make it any better.

Do you know his daughter too?

- Marija?

I understand.

She studied in Paris.

I warn you, she's a feminist.

And Serbian in addition.

Another beer, doctor?

- No, thanks.

It was in all the papers.

- What?

The route. The route was detailed

in all the newspapers.

Including when the heir apparent

would would be there.

They read about it in Belgrade too. It's

almost an invitation for a personal attack.

Probably.

After the first attack Franz Ferdinand

drove back through town again.

The first car went the wrong way,

and the others followed.

That's why they drove back slowly.  
They stopped right in front of Princip.  
That's his name?  
- Gavriilo Princip.  
They must be chased out of town.  
All the Serbs.  
Now we have an opportunity,  
do you understand?  
War, Leo. Austria has to attack  
Serbia right away.  
If we wait, the opportunity's lost.  
- Russia will support Serbia.  
And then France will get involved too.  
By the time the Russians are mobilized,  
we'll already be in Paris.  
We'll wipe France off the map.  
- We?  
Germany, with the help of your  
little operetta army.  
And then?  
- We'll deal with Russia.  
And maybe with England.  
There'll be war, sweetie.  
Don't call me that.  
- Come on, man.  
A Jew has to resolve the attack  
on the heir apparent.  
This can only happen in Austria.  
I was baptized a Protestant.  
- All of you. A Jew's a Jew.  
If you're successful,  
you can get very far in Vienna.  
Senior official Pfeffer.  
How about that?  
I have to go.  
- Won't we play billiards?  
I'm very busy.  
I wanted to speak to Frulein Jeftanovi.  
- Wait here.  
Herr Pfeffer, aren't you wasting  
your time.  
Can I talk to your father?  
Have you already had coffee?  
- No.

Cornelia, coffee for the  
investigating judge.

This is my father.

Is he the investigating judge?

- Yes.

I am.

- Where are you from?

From Esseg.

- Sit down.

I have always been loyal to  
Austria. And Germany.

Now they buy nothing from me.

What should I do with my fruit?

He can't do anything about that.

And my wheat?

- Please speak German.

We're Bosnian Serbs.

He's a Hungarian Croat.

Why should we speak German?

- Because it's our language.

Really? I fear Austria-Hungary  
isn't my homeland anymore.

A homeland is where you're comfortable.

- Are you comfortable here?

If you have no ambitions, perhaps  
if you want to serve.

Many people don't want to.

They're fighting back.

Injuring the innocent?

Women, children?

No one mourns heir apparent,  
not even in Vienna.

It's grounds to attack Serbia and  
whoever else they want to be rid of.

Did you get your car back?

No.

The file says you put it at his  
disposal. Is that so?

Along with your driver?

- We don't have one, my father drives.

So you were sitting behind the wheel?

A Serb, in the convoy of the heir  
apparent? Of course not.

Who was driving then?

- Why?

Merizzi's car was damaged after the first attack, your car was in the lead. I want to know who gave directions to the driver.

I don't know, someone from here. Our servant will give you the name. Potiorek, the ambitious Carinthian, wants to deploy the troops. And Fiedler, your boss purchased shares in Turkish railways. They need Serbia to lay track to Baghdad.

For raw materials, for big money. Don't blame him, he's embittered and has tremendous pains in his stomach.

Do you want to wait for the name of the driver here or in the garden?

In the garden, please.

What did your father mean about the railroad?

The railway from Berlin to Baghdad.

- What's wrong with that?

Some gentlemen in Berlin will become

**very rich:**

And then Germany can control Asia Minor with its troops. The line runs through friendly countries, towards a kingdom here. Serbia.

Austria gets Serbia, Wilhelm gets his railway, and Fiedler gets even richer. And annoying Serbia will no longer exist. Shall we sit down?

How old is Franz Joseph now? 83?

- 84.

He will die soon. Franz Ferdinand would have become emperor.

He wanted to give the Slavs more rights.

They killed two birds with one stone.

Their opponent's dead, and the murder is the excuse for the war.

It's not that simple.

Europe is a stack of swords  
overlapping each other like a jackstraw.

Pull one out, and the rest move.

- But when they move.

Moltke and Von Htzendorf have been  
waiting for that for years.

Do you smoke?

- No.

That's right.

You follow orders.

Are you leaving?

- We're preparing.

For the worst.

Franz Ofner. That's the name of  
the driver.

I have to go. They're expecting me.

I'll show you out.

Good morning.

Has abrinovi's father been  
arrested?

Here, please.

Can you figure out where this guy lives?

- Franz Ofner?

He allegedly drove one of the cars  
in convoy.

Princip rented a room from Danilo Illi.

We have a file on him.

23, he lives here.

A former teacher and journalist.

He wrote revolutionary pamphlets  
and articles against Austria.

He's in the interrogation room.

The Black Hand. It says here  
you're suspected to be a member.

How do you know Gavrilo Princip?

- Whom?

Your tenant.

Bring the other two detainees here.

Were you too cowardly to shoot yourself?

- I don't understand what you're talking about.

The Black Hand is a  
Serbian organization.

The officers hire killers like you.

Do you think we don't know?

We are revolutionaries.  
- Congratulations.  
The time of domination is over.  
The workers will govern  
not the parasites.  
And what are you? You let two  
teenagers do the dirty work.  
Gavrilo Princip,  
attending gymnasium.  
Nedeljko abrinovi,  
printing apprentice.  
And a unemployed journalist.  
And you know each other just by chance?  
Penniless, but you have money  
to travel and possess weapons.  
I want to know the other names.  
Who else is involved?  
Who gave you the orders?  
Throughout Bosnia  
dozens of people were arrested.  
Just because they're suspects.  
Do you want the innocent to suffer?  
Look at it.  
Martial law is now in force, people will  
be executed for the slightest thing.  
Your father's suspected of complicity.  
That's not true.  
Who else is involved?  
Trifun Grabi. I don't know the others  
Where can we find him?  
- I don't know  
He comes from Pale, his father  
is a priest.  
Is that what they teach you in the  
print shop? Making bombs, shooting?  
Simply like that?  
Do you believe in God?  
As a socialist, probably not.  
How will it be in the hereafter?  
Look at it carefully.  
Consider whether you really  
want to die for the others.  
People with ideas survive  
while the blockheads die.

Have Dr Sattler look at his hand.  
He can talk to his father.  
For half an hour.  
Under supervision.  
Danilo Illi then.  
When will charges be laid?  
Why?  
Councillor Hoyos is going to Berlin,  
to see the German Emperor.  
To report about the investigation.  
- When?  
Very soon.  
Germany is ready, Vienna too.  
The sooner there's war, the better.  
What can Hoyos tell His Majesty?  
We have a name.  
Trifun Grabi from Pale.  
I'll search the entire  
country to find him.  
There were 36 agents.  
No state police, no soldiers.  
Who gave the order?  
- I did.  
Why?  
- The military held exercises.  
The state police can't be relied on,  
too many Serbs.  
The visit was scheduled for  
St. Vitus day, the main Serb holiday.  
In a country that was just annexed.  
And nobody protects the heir apparent?  
You bring the perpetrators to justice,  
Fiedler, and I'll govern the country.  
The Emperor wants results, Pfeffer.  
I want to see Illi's house, then  
hopefully I'll discover more about it.  
Go ahead.  
And quickly, they're waiting on you.  
Take everyone with you.  
Herbert Sattler, doctor  
Herr Pfeffer, the confession.  
abrinovi admits to everything.  
Illi and Princip confirm it.  
Ten names. The weapons and instructions

came from Belgrade.

Whom did he confess to?

- Councillor Fiedler.

What did you find?

- Weapons.

And money.

- The confession must go Potiorek.

In your name, of course.

He will be very satisfied.

Strametz spoke to his father.

If you understand what I mean.

I gave him morphine.

How do you know Illi?

Danilo Illi.

This prescription came from you.

So he was one of your patients.

The prescription is for laudanum.

Opium, he was hooked.

I gave him the poison.

Him and many others.

Why?

- Because I needed the money.

Unfortunately I'm not a good doctor,

Leo.

Do you think I left Berlin to come to Sarajevo, because it's so nice here?

I was drummed out of my profession.

Now I patch up people you beat up.

I won't write that down.

The address of the driver.

What you wanted?

And?

Is he satisfied?

- Excuse me?

Governor Potiorek.

- Certainly.

He wants the report sent to Vienna as quickly as possible.

These were found in Illi's house.

Just issued by the Austrian bank.

Go check on the basis of the numbers when and to whom they were issued.

Then you can go home

to celebrate.



The famous confession.  
I'd like to speak to Franz Ofner.  
- Why?  
I work for the prosecutor's office.  
I already told the other one he  
won't be back until tomorrow.  
Whom? - The investigating judge.  
He's called Leo Pfeffer.  
I'm Leo Pfeffer.  
Do you have identification?  
- No, it's in the office.  
Goodbye.  
Excuse me, the door wasn't locked.  
Yeah, I know.  
I haven't got much to steal.  
Potiorek blocked our accounts.  
He's afraid we'll support the  
Serbs with our money.  
We can't even pay our employees.  
I'm here to say goodbye.  
Father and I will go back to Paris.  
When?  
- In two days.  
What if I go with you?  
To Paris?  
What do you want to do in Paris?  
Have children.  
Four of them.  
With you.  
The sex doesn't matter so much for me.  
What if I don't want kids?  
I'd find that very unfortunate.  
I'm married.  
Already.  
to a Frenchman.  
Do you love him?  
Not anymore. No.  
The bombers have been identified.  
There were ten of them. They were armed  
and lined the entire route.  
Serbs?  
- Bosnian Serbs.  
The majority weren't yet grown up.  
They probably got help from others.

The war's coming, and you want to have children with a Serbian. Why? You're smart, beautiful and very rich. I'll never get such a chance again. It was nice with you, Leo Pfeffer. I'm honoured, Director General. Director General Wiesner from Vienna. He came here, himself, to get your report for the emperor. I bring greetings from Minister of Foreign Affairs Berchtold. When does the trial start? - When the report is finished. Please. Drner had their confessions typed out. You only have to sign them. I can't sign. Too many questions remain unanswered. Kranjcevi, Popovi,  
Jovanovi and Mehmedbasi.  
Who brought you to Sarajevo  
over the mountains?  
We received reports from Priboj.  
What kind of messages?  
- I'll show them to you.  
Do you recognize them?  
They are farmers from Priboj.  
They admitted they helped you,  
they'll been hanged  
Dirty bastards.  
Martial law now applies,  
I can't help you or your friends.  
But I can prevent even more  
people dying, innocent people.  
What really happened?  
Take the prisoner away.  
Do you want to ruin your career,  
or just mine?  
What is he so afraid of?  
- The gallows, where he'll end up.  
The Emperor wants his nephew  
avenged. Or you won't exist anymore?

The report will be on my desk by ten o'clock tomorrow. Or you won't exist anymore.

Looters, Pfeffer.

Serbian looters.

Where's Franz Ofner?

Gone.

- And his family?

Who gave the order?

What?

Don't play dumb, Strametz.

Who gave the order?

Be glad we need your signature, you dirty Jew.

What happened to you?

Look, the press is convinced Belgrade is behind the murder.

That doesn't make any sense.

- What?

They want it to be the Serbs.

- It was them, too.

Princip, abrinovi, Illi, all 'i'es.

Who did it then?

- Don't know.

It doesn't matter anymore.

Serbia must die, there will be war.

I can stop it.

- By yourself?

Germany gives Austria a blank check, fraternal support. The Prussians are eager to pounce.

The weak will be swept away like weeds.

This is necessary for public health.

- Do you believe in racial cleansing?

You don't, I suppose.

I understand that.

Don't you care about the truth?

- Yes.

But all in good time.

I really like you, Leo.

So, I give you this advice, let it go.

Enjoy your promotion.

And your cute Serbian.

How do you know about Marija?

Pure deduction.

You're smart. Just now you're interested in Serbia?

You don't just think with the organ between your ears.

Take care of yourself.

Pardon.

Please.

- What is it?

A telegram from the bank.

About Illi's banknotes.

They were issued here last month

- To whom?

The army, for urgent medical supplies.

Who's responsible?

- The health officer.

Have him brought here.

Franz Ofner, the driver, was killed.

By the Serbs it seems.

Then there must be a record of him.

Dalibor Nikoli, Jeftanovi's clerk.

- What's the matter with him?

He was arrested yesterday.

He was looting.

Has he confessed?

- No, but eyewitnesses saw him.

In front of Franz Ofner's house.

Where is he?

- He was executed.

The Jeftanovi family are under house arrest.

Who gave that order?

- Fiedler.

Do you want to blackmail me?

What does the war with Serbia have to do with the railroad?

You invested heavily in Turkish equities, huh?

Who in Germany or Austria would invest so much in Turkish railways...

without a connection to Berlin?

- I understand it, the railroad.

First class to Baghdad?  
I'm filthy rich?  
Nice idea. You really believe that?  
A war always distorts the economy  
and is very harmful.  
That's why it should be short  
and successful.  
And then Europe is ours.  
- And then?  
France and Russia hem us in.  
In the south you have the Serbs.  
That must stop, we need more space.  
To breathe and prosper.  
And who can hold back German vigour?  
You perhaps?  
Marija Jeftanovi. Her house arrest  
has to be lifted, now.  
And her father's too.  
That won't happen, they could flee.  
They have connections in Paris.  
- Why were they charged?  
They're Serbian, and presumably  
they work with the enemy.  
They're suspected of treason.  
Unfortunately, the penalty is death.  
You need my signature. Without the  
report no one will launch an invasion.  
Austria can't rely on suspicions.  
You immensely overestimate your  
importance.  
Will you sign then?  
I understand.  
If one of the accused  
talks during the trial...  
And tells the truth, your reputation  
will be tarnished, not mine.  
Your reputation can't be tarnished.  
It's been shit from birth.  
Let Marija Jeftanovi go, then  
I'll sign the indictment.  
So it comes down to love?  
If it touches your kind,  
there is a lot to pick up.  
Your cultural heritage.

The Jeftanovi family will leave today.

Glad you finally understand, Pfeffer.

I'll draw up the papers today.

Everyone will be happy when the Serbian pigs leave.

And you take this to Wiesner, personally.

And with a smile.

They've picked up your family, huh.

That's why you wouldn't talk.

Are they still alive?

You'll be executed.

Do you want to tell me something?

He wanted to avoid it.

- Who?

Pasi. The attack.

Nicola Pasi?

The prime minister of Serbia?

So the Serbian government was against the attack?

Who else was involved?

Outside Strametz, Fiedler and you.

Who gave the instructions?

I can't name names.

I'll die anyway.

Like all my loved ones.

It's good Franz Ferdinand's dead.

Belgrade will fall.

And those rich bastards, along with Belgrade.

Like here, like everywhere.

And then?

- Then the workers will reign.

Not you, because you won't be here any longer.

Pfeffer wants to see you.

What is that?

- The indictment, for Vienna.

Finally.

Very good. So your doubts were dispelled?

The attackers were guilty, the indictment is legally defensible. But I'll prepare a report, about the background circumstances. Yeah, do that.

The fifth army will trek over the mountains to Sabac. So there will be war?

Most certainly. Our ultimatum to the Serbs was formulated... so Belgrade couldn't possibly accept.
